<u>WASHINGTON STATE OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP (WSOS)</u>: WSOS is offering two different scholarships: a Baccalaureate scholarship (BaS) and a career and technical scholarship (CTS). The BaS provides up to \$22,500 in financial aid support and access to career-launching support services for students pursuing high-demand STEM and health care majors. The CTS supports Washington students on their path to high-demand trade, STEM and health care occupations. To be eligible, Scholars must enroll in an approved

program, such as welding, manufacturing or IT, at one of Washington's 34 community and technical colleges. Scholars are eligible to receive up to \$1,500 each quarter for the duration of their associate degree, certificate or apprenticeship program. Applicants must be WA state residents, completed a FAFSA or WASFA, have a 2.75 GPA or higher, and have a total family income (adjusted gross income plus all untaxed income) that does not exceed 125% of Washington state family median income based on family size.
